



LEED Canada for New Construction: Technical Review 2009

DESCRIPTION

This one-day interactive workshop provides a technical overview of the LEED Canada for New Construction 2009 rating system. The LEED Canada NC rating system has become the definitive benchmark for what constitutes a “green building.” Understanding LEED Canada NC 2009 is an important step for any building professional in creating sustainable buildings and achieving superior economic performance.

The workshop discusses technologies and strategies that can be used to achieve credits and participants are given the opportunity to consider the synergies between the various credits. Case studies assist participants in applying their learning to real project scenarios. This workshop also briefly discusses changes that have occurred during the evolution of the NC 1.0 rating system and Addendum to the 2009 system. It is offered in English and French.

Note: this workshop, like any CaGBC education program, meets eligibility requirements for the Green Associate exam.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Individuals who wish to become more familiar with the LEED Canada NC rating system or want to earn LEED professional credentials. Individuals studying for the LEED AP with Building Design and Construction (BD&C) credential will find this a useful course to attend. The course also provides CE hours that meet the requirements for credential maintenance for LEED professionals, as well as prescriptive education for LEED APs without specialty upgrading to LEED AP with BD+C.
