



# Understanding the Living Building Challenge

## DESCRIPTION

The Living Building Challenge has swept North America. There are now more than sixty projects in process from coast to coast pursuing certification under this vigorous performance standard and interest continues to rise. This workshop provides a 6-hour introduction to the Living Building Challenge. You will also learn about key issues such as development patterns and density as well as regulatory, financial, behavioral and technological barriers and incentives. This workshop is offered in English only.
